- Economic Abuse is a seldom-talked-about yet prevalent issue faced by survivors of domestic violence in Canada.
- It is experienced by more than 94% of women who experience intimate partner violence.
- Economic abuse can have a profoundly devastating effect on women: it impacts mental health and impedes a woman's ability to leave an abuser, subsequently prolonging the amount of time she is vulnerable to harm.
- And studies have shown that 1 in 4 women experience financial abuse even after they've left an abuser.







Founded in 2018, the Canadian Center for Women's Empowerment helps domestic abuse survivors thrive and build financially strong futures. We are launching a national campaign in November to educate the survivors, financial institutions and policy makers about the different economic challenges faced by survivors of domestic violence, the prevalence of financial abuse, and the costs of recovery, stigma, unemployment and debt.

We've pledged to **Fight Economic Abuse** of domestic abuse survivors in Canada. Learn more and join us advocating for economic justice in your community.







Awareness Day





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
