The **Canadian Institute for Research on Economic Justice (CIREJ)** is a national research and knowledge-mobilization initiative led by the Canadian Center for Women's Empowerment (CCFWE).

CIREJ conducts, supports, and mobilizes research on the policies, institutions, and economic systems that shape financial security, economic opportunity, equity, and well-being across Canada.

ROLE 1: BANKING, FINANCE & FINANCIAL SERVICES

Why This Expertise Matters

Financial systems significantly influence people's ability to **access credit, secure housing, finance a business, build assets, manage financial shocks, and participate fully in the economy.**

CIREJ is seeking individuals who can bring expertise on how banking, lending, financial products, regulation, and emerging financial technologies affect economic security and opportunity.

Who We Are Seeking

Professionals, practitioners, researchers, policymakers, regulators, and leaders working across banking, finance, and financial services.

- **Banking, Lending & Access to Capital:** Consumer banking, credit and lending; mortgages and housing finance; small-business and commercial lending; business financing and access to capital.
- **Financial Inclusion & Economic Mobility:** Access to banking and credit; household financial well-being; debt and savings; credit building, asset ownership, and wealth building.
- **Financial Systems & Consumer Protection:** Consumer protection and responsible lending; financial regulation and policy; financial stability and risk; financial vulnerability, fraud, and consumer safety.
- **Innovation & the Future of Finance:** Fintech and digital banking; payments and digital financial services; alternative lending; financial innovation and emerging financial technologies.



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ROLE 2: HOUSING & HOUSING SYSTEMS

Why This Expertise Matters

Housing is fundamental to **economic security, financial well-being, health, and opportunity**. Housing affordability, supply, rental conditions, access to homeownership, financing, development, and homelessness are interconnected with household finances, employment, health, financial systems, and public policy.

CIREJ is seeking individuals who can help examine the **policies, markets, institutions, and structural conditions influencing housing stability and access across Canada**.

Who We Are Seeking

Professionals, practitioners, researchers, policymakers, and leaders working across housing and related systems.

- **Housing Affordability & Stability:** Housing affordability; rental housing and tenant stability; homelessness prevention; supportive and transitional housing.
- **Housing Supply & Development:** Affordable and community housing; housing development and construction; real estate; land use, urban planning, and housing supply.
- **Housing Finance & Homeownership:** Mortgages and housing finance; pathways to homeownership; housing-related financial vulnerability; financing for affordable and community housing.
- **Housing Policy & Systems:** Municipal, provincial, and federal housing policy; housing research and data; community development; Indigenous and community housing; housing systems planning.



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EXECUTIVE COUNCIL RESPONSIBILITIES

Executive Council members will:

- Advise on CIREJ's research agenda, priorities, and emerging economic and social issues.
- Identify emerging questions, evidence gaps, and opportunities for new research.
- Help connect CIREJ with researchers, institutions, industry partners, policymakers, community organizations, and other collaborators.
- Participate in or help lead a CIREJ Special Interest Group aligned with their expertise, where possible.
- Support the dissemination and practical application of CIREJ research through publications, consultations, events, policy discussions, and professional networks.

TERM & COMMITMENT

- **Term:** Two years, September 2026 – September 2028.
- **Meetings:** Approximately four virtual Executive Council meetings annually.
- **Preparation:** Review selected strategic or research materials in advance of meetings.
- **Participation:** Contribute advice and expertise and participate in selected research initiatives, consultations, or Special Interest Groups, where possible.
- **Overall Commitment:** The role is designed to provide meaningful engagement while remaining manageable alongside members' existing professional responsibilities.
- **Compensation:** This is a voluntary, non-remunerated leadership and advisory appointment.

- Connect real-world professional and institutional knowledge with research, policy, and community perspectives.
